2 Interview Preparation

During the interview

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Come prepared

Bring a few printed copies of your CV, along with a notepad and pen to take notes during the interview.





Show engagement

Maintain good eye contact and show genuine interest in everyone involved in the interview process.



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Stay calm and confident

Stay calm and remind yourself that it's a two-way conversation, where both sides have the opportunity to speak, listen and be heard.





Avoid money talk early

Never bring up salary or money during your first interview, as it's better to focus on your skills and suitability for the role.



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Ask questions

Be prepared with relevant questions you'd like to ask, showing your interest and enthusiasm for the role.



The 'STARR' interview method

Situation

Describe the situation, when it took place and what was involved. This is your opportunity to set the scene.





Task

As a result of this situation, what needed to happen?

Explain the task that needed to be completed to resolve the challenge.





Action

Here you'll want to provide details about the actions taken to reach the achieved goal. What was planned and for when?





Result

What was the outcome?

Describe a clear resolution, an ending to the challenge you outlined in your situation.





Reflection

What did you learn from the situation?

On reflection, would you have changed anything?
